#### **Biographical Sketch:**

Born in Hampton, New Brunswick on April 30, 1905, John Humphrey was educated at Mount Allison and McGill University. He married Jeanne Godreau in 1929 and after her death, married Dr. Margaret Kunstler in 1981. Humphrey had one brother, Douglas, and a sister, Ruth. His cousin, Jack Humphrey, became a prominent Canadian painter. After a career in private legal practice in Montreal with Wainwright, Elder, and MacDougall, Humphrey joined the McGill teaching staff in 1936 as a sessional lecturer in the Faculty of Law and became the Gale Professor of Law in 1946. Although named as McGill's Dean of Law in 1946 he never served in that function; instead, he was drafted by the United Nations to become the first director of the Human Rights Division of the United Nations. On leave from McGill, Humphrey served in his United Nations post until 1966. The author of the first draft of the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights, Humphrey was a key player behind the United Nation's approval of the declaration in 1948. During his tenure as director Humphrey pursued such human rights issues as the situation of women, freedom of the press, and racial discrimination. After his distinguished career with the United Nations, Humphrey returned to teach in McGill's Faculty of Law and continued his advocacy of human rights issues and causes.

Humphrey became an internationally renowned authority on human rights who spoke and wrote frequently on this subject throughout his life. Instrumental in the founding of the Canadian Human Rights Foundation and the Canadian Section of Amnesty International, he also served as president of both organisations. He was a member of the Royal Commission on the Status of Women in Canada and also lobbied extensively for such diverse causes as rights for imprisoned Greek lawyers, Canadian Hong Kong veterans, and Korean "comfort women," or survivors of the Japanese military system of sexual slavery during the Second World War. Humphrey was the author of numerous articles on international politics and legal subjects and the author of two books on the subject of human rights: *Human Rights and the United Nations: A Great Adventure*, published in 1984, and *No Distant Millennium: The International Law of Human Rights*, published in 1989.

Humphrey's energetic commitment to various organisations dedicated to human rights and world peace has been acknowledged by numerous honours and awards, including the United Nations Award for outstanding achievement in human rights, Officer of the Order of Canada, and the National Order of Quebec, World Legal Scholar Award, and World Federalists of Canada Peace Prize Award. Recognised as a pioneering figure in the field of human rights in the post-World War II era, John P. Humphrey died on March 14, 1995.

#### Scope and content note:

The fonds document Humphrey's role in the United Nations, academic and professional activities as a McGill professor and advocate of human rights, both in Canada and internationally, mainly 1960-1995, and after his career at the United Nations.

The series consist of 1) correspondence; 2) speeches 3) writings by John Humphrey, including the drafts of the United Nation's Universal Declaration on Human Rights; 4) diaries; 5) daily appointment books; 6) teaching and research materials; 7) subject files; 8) drafts of articles and unpublished papers by others on human rights; 9) papers of human rights organisations; 10) United Nations and related conferences; and 11) personal and family matters.

Custodial History: The fonds was acquired directly from John Humphrey and his estate.

Languages: Mainly English, with some French, and a little in Spanish and German.

**Other formats:** Diaries of John Humphrey as first director of the United Nations Division of Human Rights, 1948- 195 1 also available in *On the Edge of Greatness*, volumes 1 (1994) and 2 (1996), edited by A.J. Hobbins.

# **Series Descriptions**

# 1. Correspondence. -1960-1994. - 2.3 m of textual records.

This correspondence series, originally filed in three alphabetical blocks with no consistent internal order within the files, was rearranged by correspondent name, if there was a significant body of correspondence involving the same correspondent, with the remaining correspondence placed in chronological order.

The chronological correspondence documents John Humphrey's human right. advocacy, 1960-1994 (Files 8-77), and other causes as well as some social, personal, travel and business issues.

# 2. Speeches. - 1935-1994. - .2 m of textual records.

This series contains John Humphrey's speeches and document his role as an international authority on human rights, 1935-1994 (Files 363-374). Included in the series are pamphlets on conferences, where John Humphrey was a guest speaker, 1978-1990 (File 202).

# 3. Writings by John Humphrey. - 1939-1990. - .4 m of textual records.

This series, in part, documents Humphrey's role as a legal scholar and his interest in human rights issues by his drafts of *No Distant Millennium: The International Law of Human Rights*, 1984 (Files 91-99); a series of article drafts dealing with human rights, peace, international bill of rights, and political issues, 1973- 1993 (Files 375-379,382,383); and *Yearbook on Human Rights*, 1954 (File 259) and various reviews of John Humphrey's *Human Rights and the United Nations: A Great Adventure*, 1980-1988 (File 116). Humphrey's interest in human rights, international bill of rights and minorities also is documented by published articles and book reviews, 1939-1989 (Files 108, 138, 182, 380) and draft articles, 1952, 1966-1985 (Files 100-107, 109, 110, 243).

His activities in the United Nations are reflected by drafts of his *Human Rights and the United Nations: A Great Adventure*, 1980 (Files 78-90) and his drafts of the *Universal Declaration of Human Rights*, 1947 (Files 1-7);

His interests in literature are apparent in his draft of a novel Proof of the Pudding, n. d. (Files 121-127), a short story titled The Plot, n. d. (File 120) and other short stories, 1960 (File 128). His interest in the law firm Davidson, Wainwright & Elder is expressed in his draft of a story, n. d. (File 381). Included in the series is a file containing his Jeanne Goudreau Humphrey's notes and John Humphrey's drafts, possibly used for his lectures, books as well as unpublished stories or novels, n. d. (File 400).

Humphrey's autobiography is reflected in drafts titled *Cives mundi cum or The Great Adventure, My Great Adventure or Citizen of the World*, 1946- 1990 (Files 129- 136).

#### 4. Diaries. - 1948-1966, 1989-1994. - 48 cm of textual records.

This series of Humphrey's diaries contain reflections on Canadian and international politics and his relationship to the United Nations and other human rights organizations, 1948-1966, 1989-1994 (Files 401-414). Part of the series is a draft article titled "Human Rights inside the United Nations: The Humphrey Diaries, 1948-1959", n. d. (File 140), and a draft titled *On the Edge of Greatness*, n. d. (File 141), both by A.J. Hobbins based on Humphrey's diaries. Included in the series is Jeanne Humphrey's sporadic diary, n. d. (File 137).

#### 5. Daily Appointment Books. - 1929,1956-1958, 1960-1993. - 10 cm of textual records.

This series is a record of Humphrey's appointments as shown by his pocket diaries, 1929, 1956-1958,1960-1978 and 1985 (Files 175-177). Included in the series are his notes for diaries, 1963-1993 (File 173), an expense diary from Grenoble, France, 1929 (File 174), and business cards of lawyers and United Nations and government officials, n. d. (File 171).

#### 6. Teaching and Research Materials. - 1939-1993. - .5 m of textual records.

This series reflects Humphrey's teaching activities and interests through curriculum materials for a summer course on human rights given by the Canadian Human Rights Foundation, 1981-1983, 1985-1992 (Files 307-319), as well as by his University course notes and research material, 1939-93 (Files 144-160). His interest in public education on peace and disarmament is expressed in Consultation populaire sur la paix et le desarmement, 1987-1988 (File 337).

#### 7. Subject Files. - 1942-1994. - .4 m of textual records.

This series of Humphrey's subject files show his research interests in human rights and concerns in the human rights field and to a much lesser extent in politics, and includes files on racism, racial discrimination, protection of minorities, judicial control over prison practices, charters, asylum, self-determination of peoples, genocide, abortion, slavery, pornography, status on women religious freedom, thalidomide victims, famine in Ukraine, Meech Lake, Red Cross, peace, nongovernmental organizations; 1942-1994 (Files 212,225-236,240-242,256,258,261-265, 322, 360-362 also containing reports, agendas, newspaper clippings, pamphlets, and memoranda).

# 8. Articles and Unpublished Papers by Others on Human Rights. - 1947-1993. - .5 m of textual records.

This series denotes Humphrey's interest in human rights by draft articles, published articles, and papers, speeches, and notes by various authors, 1947,1955,1959,1964-1993 (Files 183-196,198, 215, 216, 220, 248-250, 252, 253, 257, 385-395).

#### 9. Papers of Human Rights Organizations. - 1945-1994. - .4m of textual records.

This series reflects John Humphrey's involvement in human rights, freedom of information and disarmament through human rights organizations' material including pamphlets, reports, minutes and related correspondence. # 10. United Nations and Related Conferences. - 1965, 1968, 1984-1994. - 20 cm of textual records.

This series demonstrates John Humphrey's involvement in United Nations conferences, such as the 1990 United National Workshop on the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, (File 201); Teheran Conference, 1968 (Files 199-200); Conference on Security and Co-operation in Europe, 1987 (File 210); International Law Association Conference, 1984 (File 211); Peace, International Understanding, Human Rights and the Peoples Conference, 1985 (File 266); World Conference on Religion and Peace, 1986-1994 (Files 237-238); Washington World Conference on World Peace Through Law, 1965 (File 239); Human Rights Conference, n. d. (File 244); United Nations World Conference on Human Rights, 1992-1993 (File 254); and International Commission of Jurists - Conferences, 1985-1986,1989 (Files 338-339). Included in the files are reports, memoranda, agendas, and newsletters.

#### 11. Personal and Family Matters. - 1908-1994. - 20 cm of textual records.

This series consists of Humphrey's private life as well as discussions of his United Nations activities are reflected in a small series of correspondence to his sister Ruth Humphrey, 1955-1975 (Files 166-167). Other personal correspondence consists of letters with family and friends, 1908-1994 (Files 165,169); pensions and income taxes, 1952-1992 (File 164); property in Prince Edward Island, 1984-1993 (Files 172); and estate and wills, 1979-1993 (File 163). Other files include family genealogy, 1937-1993 (Files 161-162,293); John Humphrey's awards, 1944-1992 (Files 178); newspaper clippings about John Humphrey and Jack Humphrey, 1929-1993 (Files 179-181); and travel receipts and itineraries, 1986-1991 (File 143).

# Container 3, File 14 Letter Book 6. - April 1969-September 1970. - 3 cm of textual records. - English and French.

File contains one bound letter book of outgoing correspondence in by John Humphrey dealing with personal, social, business, travel, academic and human rights issues, and conferences. The letter book is titled *Chronological File* 6, *Prof. J. P. Humphrey* and covers August 1968 to March 1969. The letters are arranged chronologically and are signed by John Humphrey as Professor of Law and Political Science at McGill. The correspondence is mainly with McGill and other universities and law schools, professors, justices, various divisions of the United Nations, insurance and trust companies, the Royal Victoria Hospital, the Port Royal Apartments, and friends.

#### Container 3, File 15 Correspondence. - 1970-1971. - one folder of textual records. - English and French.

File consists of two incoming letters, and one outgoing letter, in English and French. One of the incoming letters is from Traveler's Insurance Company and the other one from the United Nations' Mr. Das Karnleshwar concerning Dr. Humphrey's proposals for the implementation of economic and social rights. The third letter is a response from Dr. Humphrey to Mr. Das Kamleshwar.

File contains chronologically organized incoming correspondence from International Law Association, colleagues from the United Nations and the United Nations division regarding the 25'h anniversary of the adoption of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Included are letters commenting on John Humphrey's article "International Law of Human Rights in the Middle of the Twentieth Century".

# Container 3, File 17 Correspondence. - January- June, 1973. - one folder of textual records. - English and French.

File consists of chronologically organized, incoming and outgoing correspondence. The correspondence deals with human rights, and academic, business and personal issues, and is mainly with universities, law schools, the International Law Organization, and the International League for Rights of Man. Included in the file are memoranda, articles regarding human rights and United Nations subjects, and correspondence relating to articles by John Humphrey. The letters are signed by John Humphrey as Professor of Law and Political Science at McGill.

# Container 3, 18 Correspondence. - July-December, 1973. - one folder of textual records. - English and French.

File consists of chronologically organized correspondence, mostly incoming. The correspondence deals with human rights, and academic, business and personal issues, and is from

universities, law schools, the International Law Organization, the United Nations, the Port Royal Apartments, the Canadian Council on International Law, the House of Commons, Ottawa, the Congress of the United States, the World Peace through Law Center, the Canadian Institute for Public Interest Rights, the International League of the Right of Man, and the International Institute of Human Rights. The letters are signed by John Humphrey as Professor of Law and Political Science at McGill.

#### Container 3, File 19 Correspondence. - January-May, 1974. - one folder of textual records. - English and French.

File consists of chronologically organized, mostly typed, incoming and outgoing correspondence dealing mainly with human rights seminars, and articles written by John Humphrey. The letters are signed by John Humphrey as Professor of Law and Political Science at McGill. The correspondence is mainly with the International League of the Rights of Man, universities, law schools, the United Nations, House of Commons, and the International Law Association. Included are articles related to the United Nations and papers presented at meetings.

# Container 3, File 20 Correspondence. - January-December, 1975. - one folder of textual records. - English and French.

File consists of chronologically organized, incoming and outgoing correspondence dealing mainly with human rights issues, and meetings. The letters are signed by John Humphrey as Professor of Law and Political Science at McGill. The correspondence is primarily with the International Law Organization, the United Nations, and the Office of Prime Minister of Canada. Included are drafts on prevention of torture and other cruel treatment and punishment.

# Container 3, File 21 Correspondence. - January-December, 1976. one folder of textual records. - English and French.

File consists of chronologically organized, incoming and outgoing correspondence dealing with human rights and academic issues, and seminars. The letters are signed by John Humphrey as Professor of Law and Political Science at McGill. The correspondence is mainly with universities, law schools, deans, the United Nations, the World Association of Lawyers, the World Peace Through Law Center, and the CBC. Correspondence relating to articles by John Humphrey is also part of the file.

# Container 3, File 22 Correspondence. - January-December, 1977. one folder of textual records. - English and French.

File consists of chronologically organized, incoming and outgoing correspondence dealing with human rights, and academic and business issues, conferences, seminars, and book reviews. The

letters are signed by John Humphrey as Professor of Law and Political Science at McGill. The correspondence is mainly with universities, law schools, deans, the United Nations, the International Institute of Human Rights, the Department of External Affairs, Ottawa, and Montreal Trust Company. Correspondence regarding an award to John Humphrey of an honorary degree of Doctor of Civil Law from Mt. Allison University, New Brunswick, is part of the file.

#### Container 3, File 23 Correspondence. - January-December, 1978. one folder of textual records. - English and French.

File consists of chronologically organized, incoming and outgoing correspondence dealing with human rights, academic issues, conferences, and articles by John Humphrey. The letters are signed by John Humphrey as Professor of Law and Political Science at McGill. The correspondence is mainly with universities, law schools, the United Nations, the International Commission of Jurists, the Minority Rights Group, the International Institute of Human Rights, UNESCO, and the Department of External Affairs, Ottawa.

# Container 3, File 24 Correspondence. - January-November, 1979. one folder of textual records. - English and French.

File contains a daily diary by John Humphrey. The fourth diary continues with Humphrey's holidays in Chester, Nova Scotia. The main portion of the diary covers Humphrey's activity in the United Nations providing support for the Committees of the General Assembly and the Human Rights Commission, recruitment to the Division, discussion on freedom of information, International Refugee Organization, trade union rights and Humphrey's membership on a special Board of Inquiry.

## Container 20, File 405 Fifth Diary. - February 27, 1950 - July 12, 1950. - 3 cm - handwritten. - English.

File contains a daily diary by- John Humphrey. The fifth diary starts with Humphrey's involvement in the United Nations Economic and Social Council and meeting of the Human Rights Commission, and continues with his travels to meeting about the freedom of information and the press held in Uruguay. From Uruguay, Humphrey with his wife sailed through Santos to Montevideo, where they spent three weeks of May. Humphrey then took a ten days holiday with his wife in Buenos Aires, where the contrast between the wealth and military presence and suppression of freedom of information, was very apparent. At the end of June, Humphrey attended Economic and Social Council meetings and the Third Committee of the General Assembly in Geneva.

## Container 20, File 406 Sixth Diary. - July 13, 1950 - October 25, 1950. - 3 cm. - handwritten. - English.

File contains a daily diary by John Humphrey. The sixth diary continues with the meeting of the United Nations Economic and Social Council, the Third Committee of the General Assembly and the Ad Hoc Committee on Statelessness in Geneva. Humphrey's holidays in Northern Italy were followed by a trip to Paris, where he is involved in the publicity of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights with UNESCO. Upon his return to a new headquarters of the United Nations, he discovers to his disappointment, that Henri Laugier, his friend and superior, will no longer serve the United Nations.

## Container 20, File 407 Seventh Diary. - October 26, 1950 - March 2, 1951. - 3 cm. - handwritten. - English.

File contains a daily diary by John Humphrey. The seventh diary is set in New York dealing with meetings of the United Nations Third Committee of the General Assembly on the International Covenant on Human Rights. The diary notes that the situation in the Secretariat is difficult. Humphrey traveled to Santiago for the Economic and Social Council's spring session. On his way to Chile, he visited his friend, Emile Vaillancourt, a Canadian Ambassador in Peru.

File contains a daily diary by John Humphrey. The eighth diary begins with the ending of the V' spring sessions of the United Nations Economic and Social Council, and the Human Rights Commission in Santiago. After Humphrey's return to New York, he traveled to Europe and visited Geneva (where Charles Malik replaced Eleanor Roosevelt as a Chairman of the Human Rights Commission) and Germany (where he concentrated on the issue of compensation the survivors of medical experiments during the war). Before going back to Geneva to participate on the Conference on Refugees and Stateless Persons, Humphrey and his wife took holidays in Spain.

## Container 20, File 409 Ninth Diary. - July 15, 1951 - November 7, 1951. - 3 cm - handwritten. - English.

File contains a daily diary by John Humphrey. The ninth diary concludes the United Nations Conference on Refugees and Stateless Persons and sessions of the Economic and Social Council and the Third Committee of the General Assembly. At the end of August, Guillaume Georges-Picot is appointed the Assistant Secretary-General for Foreign Affairs (replacing Henri Laugier). Humphrey and his wife met Picasso during their five day visit with Henri Laugier in Antibes. At the end of September, the Humphreys left for their three week trip to Spain, after which Humphrey returned to Paris to attend a series of meetings of the Executive Board of UNESCO.

## Container 20, File 410 Tenth Diary. - November 8, 1951 - February 18, 1953. - 3 cm. - handwritten. - English.

File contains a daily diary by John Humphrey. The diary begins with the completion of the Executive Board of UNESCO meetings, and continues with the opening of the Third and the Fifth Committees of the General Assembly in Paris. The Humphreys spent their Christmas in Cannes, and on December 29 they returned back to Paris. The next day they continued to London, where, on New Year's Day, Humphrey had a speech before the Council for Education in World Citizenship.

## Container 20, File 411 Eleventh Diary. - May 1,1953 - January 26,1955. - 3 cm. - handwritten. - English.

File contains a daily diary by John Humphrey. The appointment of Dag Hammarskjold to the position of the United Nations Secretary-General at fist pleases Humphrey. He is soon aware

of the Secretary-General's goals of reducing the Secretariat's manpower, especially in the human rights program. With the absence of Georges-Picot, Humphrey assumes the roles of Acting Top Ranking Director and Acting Assistant Secretary-General of the Social Department, where he is involved in the reorganization plan. In the end, the Social Department is combined with the Department of Economic Affairs, which dissatisfies Humphrey. The Division continues to support United Nations projects, especially pertaining to human rights, with diminishing resources.

## Container 20, File 412 Twelfth Diary. - January 29,1955 - September 23,1955. - 3 cm. - handwritten. - English.

File contains a daily diary by John Humphrey. The twelfth diary starts with the Humphrey's vacation in the West Indies and his trip to Geneva for the Non-Governmental Organizations Conference on Discrimination in the Human Rights Commission. Upon returning to New York, Humphrey had his first encounter with Dag Hammarskjold concerning the human rights program, but the Secretary-General firmly maintains his decision to reduce resources. Humphrey was required to defend these measures at the Economic and Social Council meeting in Geneva. He then attended the Friends Diplomatic Conference in Clarens.

## Container 20, File 413 Thirteenth Diary. - September 26, 1955 - [August 21, 1957]. - 3 cm. - handwritten. -English.

File contains a daily diary by John Humphrey. The thirteenth diary begins in New York with the debates of the United Nations Third Committee on the human rights covenants and self-determination of peoples. A comprehensive resolution on advisory services is approved by the Third Committee, which gave the Human Rights Division a new direction with a seminar program. The first part of 1956 includes a vacation in New West Indies, and reorganization of the Division. The diary was interrupted for three months from May to August. It resumed in Geneva for the Slavery Conference. It was again interrupted from October 1956 to February 1957. It resumed with Humphrey's visit to several countries to implement the seminar program.

## Container 20, File 414 Fourteenth Diary. – September 12, [1957] – February 3, [1959]. - 3 cm - handwritten. -English.

File contains a daily diary (with gaps) by John Humphrey. The fourteenth diary begins with discussions concerning a conference on human rights in the Philippines attended by John Humphrey. The diary continues with Humphrey's views on the transfer of ultimate responsibility for the division on human rights from Phillippe de Seyres to Sir Humphrey Trevelyan. Humphrey also records his travels to South America where he attended a human rights conference and laid the groundwork for the setting up of more seminars in the future. After meetings with Trevelyan in Geneva he returns to New York where he discovers that Trevelyan will resign. Humphrey then travels to Canada for celebrations on the tenth anniversary of the Universal Declaration on Human Rights.

## Container 20, File 415 Fifteenth Diary. - June 8, 1960 - October 3, [1960], November 16,1964 - April 27, [1966] with other gaps. - 3 cm. - handwritten. - English and French.

File contains a daily dairy by John Humphrey. In the fifteenth diary Humphrey records his voyage to Vienna to open a seminar on Human Rights and to Geneva for United Nations committee meetings. In 1964, he comments on current political problems such as Vietnam and takes a holiday in St. Vincent. In 1965, he attends human rights conferences in Iran and Mongolia and visits Hungary and Yugoslavia. The diary ends with his retirement from the United Nations and his move to Montreal.

#### John P. Humphrey, 1905-1995.

#### **Biographical Note:**

John Peters Humphrey was born in Hampton, New Brunswick on April 30 1905, and educated at Mount Allison and McGill University. He was married twice, first to Jeanne Godreau in 1929, and to Dr. Margaret Kunstler-Humphrey in 1981. Humphrey joined the McGill teaching staff in 1936 as a sessional lecturer in the Faculty of Law and became the Gale Professor of Law in 1946. Although named as McGill's Dean of Law in 1946 he never served in that function, leaving instead to join the United Nations as the first director of the Human Rights Division of the United Nations. He held this post until 1966.

The author of the first draft of the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights, Humphrey was a key player behind the United Nation's approval of the declaration in 1948. During his tenure as Director, Humphrey pursued such human rights issues as the status of women, freedom of the press, and racial discrimination. After his distinguished career with the United Nations Humphrey returned to teach in McGill's Faculty of Law and continued his advocacy of human rights issues and causes.

Humphrey became an internationally recognized authority on human rights, speaking and writing on these issues throughout his life. He was instrumental in the founding of the Canadian Human Rights Foundation and the Canadian Section of Amnesty International, and served as president of both organizations. He was also a member of the Royal Commission on the Status of Women in Canada and participated in campaigns around such diverse causes as rights for imprisoned Greek lawyers, Canadian Hong Kong veterans, and Korean comfort women.

He was author of numerous publications on international politics, legal issues, and human rights, including two books: <u>Human Rights and the United Nations: A Great</u> <u>Adventure</u> (1984), and <u>No Distant Millennium</u> (1989). He was also the author of unpublished literary manuscripts, a short story and a novel.

Numerous honours and awards, including the National Order of Quebec, The World Legal Scholar Award, and the Order of Canada, have acknowledged Humphrey's energetic commitment to human rights and world peace.

John Peters Humphrey, a key figure in Canadian legal history and a pioneer in the human rights legislation in the post 1945 era died on March 14, 1995.

Includes **correspondence** 1906-1995 (predominant is Humphrey's correspondence with his sister Ruth 1918-1972, family correspondence, and some U.N. communications); Humphrey's **speeches** 1947-1993, and publications 1912-1993; **teaching notes** for McGill University law courses (International, Public and Roman Laws) 1937-1946, 1967-1994; **audio-visual materials** include interviews with Humphrey 1961-1998; **awards**, **diplomas**, **honours** 1966-1991; **photographs** 1895-c. 1980 include family images but predominantly reflect formal events with the United Nations and Humphrey's international career. Also included are two **Jori Smith portraits** of Humphrey c. 1934 and c. 1939. Among his unpublished manuscripts included in this accession are "My Great Adventure" and "At the Border". Note that "My Great Adventure" written between 1985 and 1990 includes reminiscences of a personal nature about his life prior to joining the U.N. and is not to be confused with Humphrey's published work <u>A Great Adventure</u>.

The accession includes reflections and descriptions of Humphrey's years in school and in the United Nations through personal and professional correspondence, speeches, drafts of his publications as well as unpublished works. Also included are Humphrey's awards, teaching/research notes (law), various documents relating to post-U.N. work in human rights, some genealogical material and other personal miscellany. Most photographs relate to Humphrey's work with the United Nations.

#### Notes on Arrangement:

Accession listing reflects the arrangement of the materials upon transfer to the MUA. Arrangement is generally by type (i.e. textual, photograph, audiovisual etc.) with some content groupings (e.g. correspondence between John P. Humphrey and his sister Ruth; material pertaining to Japanese post-war compensation, etc.). Some textual materials files (correspondence) include photographs, which are indicated by "(+ photo)" following the file title. The photographs are listed in separately numbered files – awards are in boxes 6, 8 & 9, wrapped in tissue with identification indicated on the wrapping.
